## Worship Update

#### **Sunday Schedule:**

**Sunday, January 5th,** we worship together in ONE service at 10am. We welcome Rev. Dr. Marcus Miller as our worship leader this day!

#### Sundays, January 12, 19, & 26 :

we return to two services at 9 a.m. Contemporary (livestream) & 11 a.m. (Traditional) with Sunday School and Fellowship between services.



Pastor Miller was born and raised in Southgate, MI (a Detroit suburb) where his father was a Lutheran pastor and his mother an elementary school teacher. He served in five calls from 1971-2012: teacher of religion and German at Martin Luther High School in Maspeth, New York (1971-73), Pastor of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Mt. Vernon, NY (1973-79), Pastor of the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, Brooklyn, OH (1979-95), Bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod, ELCA (1995-2006), and President of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, Columbia, SC (2006-12) while Pastor Lisa and Pastor Michael were students. From November 1, 2013 until August 31, 2014, he was the Interim Bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod upon Bishop Eaton's election as Presiding Bishop of the ELCA. He has served numerous congregational interims in his retirement including here at CIC. Pastor Miller supports and encourages various ministries of social justice and compassion both during his time as a parish pastor and a synod bishop and now in retirement. Pastor Miller and his wife, Katherine, a retired Registered Nurse and Middle School Band Director, live in Huntersville. They have two children and five grandchildren they are happy to share about!

### From the Pastors......

11n the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, 2the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. 3Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. 4And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. 5God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. -Genesis 1:1-5

The last several weeks have been a whirlwind, as is typical this time of year. Thank you, thank you for all the various ways you contributed to the ministries of CIC! God has been at work through our family of faith, and our greater community is blessed by our collective efforts.

We wanted to take this space to specifically highlight some Outreach Ministries that have occurred over the months of November & December. You've heard about them and assisted with them in various capacities, but it's helpful to have them all in the same spot to get a sense of the impact that has been made.

- **Thanksgiving Meal:** Food was donated, prepared, and served to over 120 of our LKN neighbors at the church on November 24th.
- Angel Tree: Over 100 Angels were collected for East Lincoln Christian Ministry, LSC Foster Care Program, LSC New Americans Program, and Family Reunification for Immigrant Youth.
- Hurricane Relief: 21 flood buckets and 104 comfort care kits were assembled by the youth. The Quilting Ministry sent 16 quilts to Western Carolina.
- **Prayer Shawl Ministry:** Gifted 6 shawls to Hospice, 16 hat/scarf sets and 43 hats to ELCM, as well as 20 hat/scarf sets to the Dwelling.
- **Bags of Hope:** In the grocery cart, we collected items for Bags of Hope which is a non-profit ministry providing weekend food provisions to school children in the Lake Norman area who experience food insecurity.

These are just some of the ways that we have, in the last several weeks, extended the love of God to our neighbors through CIC. And none of these things occurred by accident. Similar to the creation story, where we hear how God strategically and thought-fully went about the process of forming the world, at CIC we do not haphazardly go about promoting and implementing Outreach projects (we actually try to not to do anything haphazardly).

As was shared at the Annual Meeting last spring, the Church Council has updated the process through which congregational Outreach Projects are approved, promoted, and implemented. This process helps us to be thoughtful in the timing of when projects are done as well as assuring the projects align with CIC's values and mission. The Outreach Plan can be read <u>HERE</u>. If you are interested in doing an outreach project at CIC, that form can be found <u>HERE</u>. After forms are submitted, if there are any questions regarding the timing or the idea in general, a member of the Outreach Committee will be in communication with you to discuss the project and further assist in the submission process. Once approved, the project can move forward with promotion and implementation.

We know this is a new process and it may take some getting used to. Please reach out to either one of us or Kathy Dutton, chair of the Outreach Committee, if you have any questions.

Following this article, we encourage you to read about the Operation Christmas Drop reflection by Suzi Hinrichs. Suzi had the idea for this outreach possibility, went through the process described above, and the ministry experience and results were extremely fruitful.

God can certainly work through chaos (that definitely happens at the church from time to time), but the pattern that was established "in the beginning" had much more of a planned out and thought through approach. As we begin a new year, we're eager to see what God will do as we more fully utilize this ministry plan.

#### OPERATION CHRISTMAS DROP #73 IS OFFICIALLY COMPLETE!

Approximately 300 military personnel participated in Operation Christmas Drop #73. Six C 130s dropped 77,300 pounds of supplies to more than 58 sites/islands accumulating 224 flight hours from December 8 – December 14.

More than 3,600 pounds of these supplies were donated by members, family, and friends of Community in Christ Lutheran Church. In total CIC donated \$779 toward the OCD Amazon Christmas list purchasing 42 various items. We also donated \$3600 to purchase nine Santa Boxes, each holding 400 pounds of supplies. Our Vacation Bible School Campers made 50 Christmas Cards and 30 Bookmarks which were also included in our Santa Boxes.

On October 29th I was able to meet the President of the OCD volunteer group. Theresa and I chatted for about 30 minutes. I asked her many questions about the operation. She was overwhelmed by our donation. When she opened the envelope with the check, she looked at me and said, "Are you sure?" I assured her, we were sure.

On January 12th I will have the opportunity to share more information with the congregation during a Temple Talk about OCD #73.

#### <u>Hurricane Helene</u>

Lutherans have been active in Western North Carolina all Fall trying to help those in the area recover and rebuild from Hurricane Helene. If you want regular updates on what our wider church is doing, and seeing glimpses of how you can help, be sure to regularly check the NC Synod's social media accounts and website as well as Lutheran Disaster Response Carolina's Facebook page and blog. Here's just a sampling:

Lutheran Disaster Response was awarded a \$2 million (yes, you read that correctly!) grant from the Emergency and Disaster Response Fund (EDRF) from The Community Foundation of Western North Carolina to support their Bridging Together partnership with Mennonite Disaster Service. The Community Foundation of Western North Carolina also awarded Lutheran Services Carolinas (LSC) a grant of \$25,000 from its Emergency and Disaster Response Fund to help cover hurricane-related expenses. This grant has helped defray the cost of generator fuel, water deliveries in large tanker trucks while water was unsafe, and portable handwashing stations and toilets. LSC has worked diligently to make sure residents and clients are safe.

Lutheridge has acquired a portable lumber mill to turn fallen trees into usable lumber to rebuild and create new structures and signage all around camp. "The same trees that have stood watch over camp for generations will continue to provide shelter and hope for campers and guests. Thanks be to God!"

Congregations from around the NC Synod, including ours, have provided requested supplies to distribution sites as well as sent volunteers to help places like Lutheridge get to a place of being not only open for retreats but also being hubs for helpers.




#### One Blood's Big Red Bus

Lutheran Theological Seminary will have its opening service on the Lenoir-Rhyne University Campus on Wednesday, January 15th, at 10am. The opening service will highlight both the arrival of LTSS and the beginning of a new semester and include Holy Communion. The Rev. Todd Cutter, university pastor, director of spiritual life and director of counseling services is a graduate of both Lenoir-Rhyne and Lutheran Theological Southern

Seminary and will preach. Beverly Wallace, director of lifelong learning at the seminary, will preside at Eucharist, and Melanie Dobson, associate professor and the Lefler and Wohltmann Chair in Methodist Studies, will preside over portions of the liturgy.

#### NC DOT UPDATE

As has been discussed at the last two Congregational Meetings, HWY 73 will be undergoing an expansion project that will result in CIC losing a small portion of our property that is parallel to HWY 73. Our lawyer continues to be in conversation with the agent representing the North Carolina Department of Transportation. No settlement has been reached at this time. Because of Hurricane Helene and some other extenuating circumstances within the court system, the settlement process has been paused. The NCDOT has provided new estimated start dates for the project: Utility relocation is now set to start 4/30/26. Construction set date is 7/18/28. We will continue to provide updates as they become available .

#### Finance Page

November gifts brought in \$35.4k. YTD we are at \$191.5k (PY \$190.4k), 5% behind the Budget. Please refer to the recent Council appeal regarding the need for continued financial support and possible giving increase due to higher insurance costs. Preschool Tuition Revenue (including scholarship) was \$13.1k. Preschool Revenues YTD are \$53.3k. This is lower than previous years due to 15% lower enrollment caused by a demographic dip. In positive Preschool news, the 25th Year Celebration wrapped up with almost \$10k in donations towards the Scholarship Fund, and the recent Jingle Jog Classroom Supply Fundraiser brought in \$3.4k in donations which will be of great help in offsetting classroom expenses during this tough time. Other Revenues consisted mainly of facility rents (\$0.7k) and Thrivent Choice dollars (\$0.7k), for a total of \$1.5k (\$3.8k YTD). Total Revenues for the month were \$50k. YTD we are at \$248.1k (PY \$257.1k). Expense items of interest: Worship - Altar Supplies: \$0.4, replenishment of altar bread and wine; Worship - Advent Devotionals: \$0.4; Admin - Internet/Office Telephone: we were billed for 2 months after no bill last month (we switched to a cheaper plan and billing was delayed till Nov). Music – Maintenance: \$0.3 instrument tuning, Music - Guest Artist: \$0.2k fees to flute player. Total Expenses for the month were \$56.1k, YTD \$283.9 (PY \$280.7k). Bottomline, November deficit was \$6.1k. YTD our deficit is \$35.8k. Additionally, in Nov we paid \$2k for plumbing repairs in the Men's Restroom in the Sanctuary and we purchased additional magnetic name tags for \$0.5k. Both those were paid from leftover prior year funds. Looking ahead to the next month, we priced out the cost of replacing damaged carpet tiles in the Sanctuary, two quotes came in between \$9-10k. This repair will be paid from the Capital/Emergency designated account. ~Madalyn Wilkinson, Finance Director
